MISSION

This Policy defines the behaviour of the ITURRI Group with the aim of encouraging sustainable and responsible business behaviour throughout its supply chain, promoting best practices in the purchase and contracting of goods and services through management that considers and integrates the rights of workers, the environment, the social and economic spheres.

With this Policy we aim to integrate the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) throughout the procurement process to contribute to the goals of ensuring compliance with applicable human rights and environmental protection standards to promote a more just and sustainable global economy, as well as responsible corporate governance.

COMMITMENTS



To ensure that the principles of ethics and integrity, equal opportunities and free competition, transparency and traceability, independence and objectivity in decision-making are respected.



Verify that all suppliers and supply chains comply with Human Rights, as well as the requirements established as suppliers according to SA8000.2014.



To positively value climate action by contracting third parties that demonstrate more responsible and efficient consumption of energy and water resources, and that provide proposals involving energy efficiency, as well as best practices in responsible consumption of raw materials and circular economy.



Prioritise the purchase option, whenever possible, of partially or fully sustainable products, made from recycled material or that are end-of-life recyclable.



Promote local trade.



Train, sensitise, standardise and inspect both buyers and suppliers on ethics and legal compliance, as well as on CSR aspects and encourage them, in turn, to transfer this commitment to their supply chain.



To multiply the positive impacts on the market, and therefore, we consider our ability to exert a pull effect on CSR values, in turn driving value creation, job creation, excellence and competitiveness among our suppliers.

This Policy applies to the entire ITURRI Group, the companies of the Group where there is effective control, their administrators and employees, as well as the purchasing departments and third parties with whom there are legal relations and who have adhered to the same.
